How Do I Register My Child for Camp?

Online Registration begins Saturday, March 23 @ 9 am for Athens-Clarke County residents only.

Registration for out of county residents begins March 25 at Noon.

Out of county resident.....\$105/week
*Limit of 4 weeks per camper.

Teen Camp

Athens-Clarke Co. resident.....\$80/week
Out of county resident.....\$120/week
*Limit of 2 weeks per camper.

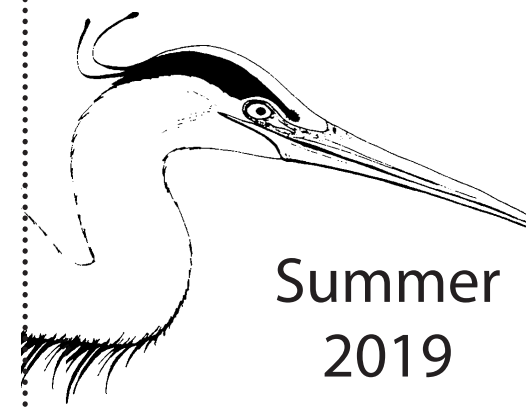

Be prepared for registration:

- Child must be 7 by the beginning of their camp session (13 for Teen Camp).
- Create an online profile in advance – go to <https://www.accgov.com/148/Leisure-Services>
- After creating a profile, Sandy Creek Nature Center members must send an email to scncinc@gmail.com by March 20 so we may activate their discount.
- Apply for scholarships at least one week before March 23.
- Scholarships apply to camp fee only, not before/aftercare
- All camp fees due at time of registration
- You may choose either a membership or scholarship discount – you cannot use both together.

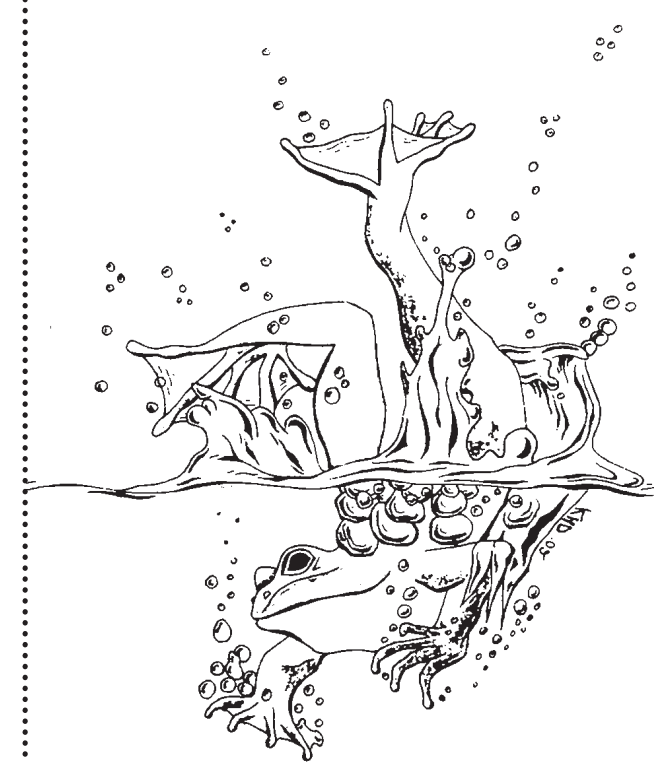

Sessions for Campers Ages 7-12

Limit of 4 weeks per camper

June 3-7
Nature Art

Discover the beauty of the night sky and the beauty of plants and animals through art. This week campers will get up close with their artistic side while hiking the Greenway to make a fairy house, hiking along the trails to make natural art, getting up close with animals and having fun. Includes a Greenway hike.

June 10-14
Water Safari

Wade into our waterways and find animals living in the pond, creek and lake. Take a walk in Sandy Creek, make boats, play water games and enjoy summer water fun. Paddle through a canoe obstacle course and enjoy a beach party at Sandy Creek Park.

June 17-21
Dirt Week

Composting, creekwalks, mudpies and a whole bunch of dirt is a great way to spend summer camp. Prepare for kids to come home dirty every day. Help us celebrate the wonders of dirt as we celebrate dirt week.

June 24-28
Five Kingdoms

Delve into the living world and discover the animal/plant/fungal/bacteria kingdoms. Get up close with animals and plants, & use microscopes to see a hidden world. Participate in a nature-themed jousting competition and 5 kingdom battle at Sandy Creek Park. Includes Cook's Trail Hike.

Refund/Cancellation policy:

- All refunds will be assessed a 25% administrative fee.
- If a program is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment or other reason, Leisure Services will issue a full refund to all registered individuals.
- No refunds will be issued after the start of a program.
- Refund requests must include a Refund Form and must be approved by the Dept. Director.
- Refunds will not be granted less than 7 business days before a program begins without a written medical excuse from a licensed physician.
